ACCREDITATION

An added value to what you learn

The American College of Thessaloniki is fully accredited by the **New England Commission of Higher Education** (NECHE) . **NECHE** is among the oldest and most prestigious accrediting bodies in the US and is responsible for accrediting some of the most highly ranked US colleges and universities such as Harvard and Yale. NECHE accreditation ensures that ACT meets or exceeds relevant standards for institutional quality and that it has available the necessary resources to achieve its stated purposes through appropriate educational programs.

In addition to NECHE accreditation, ACT's undergraduate degree programs are currently validated by the **Open University**, UK. This validation ensures that ACT's degree programs meet the requirements of European Union directive 36/2005 governing the recognition of degrees and professional rights throughout Europe. Since Fall 2013, all entering students complete a single course of studies leading simultaneously to a dual degree: the US degree issued by ACT and accredited by NECHE and a European degree ("validated Honors Diploma") awarded directly by the Open University.

ACT holds an operating license by the **Greek Ministry of Education** under a governmental decree that recognizes the right of private post-secondary educational institutions to operate in Greece as "Colleges". This action affirms, once again, **ACT's premier status as one of the few institutions in Europe to be both US accredited and EU validated.**

Our Computing degree offers courses in the areas of **Programming and Software Development, Database Design and Programming, Web Development, Robotics and Networks**.



Thessaloniki is the second largest city in Greece; a true cross-roads between East and West, and a gateway to Southeastern Europe. Founded in 315 B.C., historic Thessaloniki is now a modern seaport city of over one million inhabitants renowned for its wide avenues, quaint squares, tree-lined streets, neoclassical buildings, Byzantine monuments, historical museums, modern theaters, ancient ruins, and warm hospitality. Discover tasteful restaurants, hip cafes, bustling clubs, and elegant shops.

From the beautiful sandy beaches and crystal clear blue waters of the Chalkidiki peninsula, to the snow covered ski resorts and challenging mountain treks, it's all within a short drive away. Thessaloniki is ideally located to offer the best of both worlds.

Most importantly, Thessaloniki is a lively university town with well over 100,000 university students. Literally, more than 1 out of every 10 residents is a student. With a large student population, this vibrant city invites and welcomes young people from all over the world.





ADMISSIONS

Our admissions philosophy is focused on drawing students to ACT who will become active members of the campus community and help us move the campus toward its primary goals for innovative and interactive learning. Each application for admission is carefully reviewed to assess the student's academic ability and willingness to be part of a vibrant community atmosphere. We want to ensure that every student who enrolls at ACT will uphold the standards of integrity and personal responsibility we expect of each member of the broader Anatolia learning community.

There are two intake periods; one in the fall and one in the spring. We review all applicants on a rolling basis. Please go to www.act.edu for more details.

How do I apply?

US applicants are required to submit the following when applying for admission to the College:

- An Application Form.
- Official transcripts of 9th, 10th, 11th grades, and a grade report of the 12th grade.
- Personal essay. Please choose one topic and see prompts below:
 - Why is international education important and how will it help you achieve a global perspective?
 - Share a personal anecdote that will help us understand what you will bring to the ACT community.
 - Choose one of the essay questions listed on the Common Application.
- One letter of recommendation from a teacher/advisor.
- SAT/ACT scores (optional). Test scores can be sent directly to us by indicating our institutional code on the score request form (ACT Code: 7941).
- A recent passport-size color photograph.
- A photocopy of your valid passport or state ID.
- A non-refundable application fee of \$50.00. The application fee should be deposited at one of ACT's bank accounts or submitted to our Boston office via check. A copy of the bank receipt should accompany the application.

Can I transfer to ACT?

ACT grants transfer credits to courses completed at accredited institutions, with a minimum grade of C or its equivalent, and that apply towards the ACT curriculum.

- Candidates should submit the following:
- An Application Form.
- An official transcript of grades.
- Copies of course syllabi for all the courses you have completed and for those on which you are currently enrolled.
- A copy of your institution's catalogue current to your period of attendance.
- A recent passport-size color photograph.
- A photocopy of your valid passport or state ID.
- A non-refundable application fee of \$50.00. The application fee should be deposited at one of ACT's bank accounts or submitted to our Boston office via check. A copy of the bank receipt should accompany the application.

All application documentation should be submitted using the online application portal <https://admissions.act.edu/>.





Where will I be living?

ACT supports incoming students during their first year of studies by offering on-campus housing and support in finding off-campus housing. ACT offers limited housing on-campus on a first-come, first served basis. When campus housing is filled, we will assist you in locating off-campus housing. We offer on-campus housing on a first come, first served basis, in which case on-campus housing is not guaranteed after the space is filled; however, we will assist in finding off-campus housing for every first-year student.

Upon acceptance, you will receive a welcome email from Student Services that includes housing information and the ACT housing application. The housing application deadline is May 1st. Housing deposits are due by June 1. After that date, if ACT housing fills up or you decide to find independent housing, we will apply your deposit towards your tuition at ACT. If housing remains an issue by May 31st and you completely withdraw your application to study at ACT, we will refund your enrollment and housing deposits.

The vast majority of students live in off-campus housing. ACT's Office of Student Services helps students secure off-campus housing on an individual basis.

- On-campus housing \$120.00 per month, double capacity (limited availability)
- Off-campus rental fees range from \$334.00-\$735.00 per month.
- The monthly cost of living ranges \$166.00-\$334.00 per month, depending on lifestyle.



Do I need a visa?

All non-EU students are required to enter Greece on a student visa obtained from the Greek Embassy of their home country. Only students holding a student visa will be eligible to apply for a long term residence permit in Greece. ACT offers assistance with both the student visa and the long term residence permit procedures. The cost of the Visa & Residence Permit are the responsibility of the student and it must be renewed each year.

Freshman and Transfer US candidates can qualify for one of the following scholarships:


- **Merit-based:** \$1,000.00 (Awarded to students with exceptional academic and achievement records)
- **Greek Heritage:** \$ 1,000.00 (Awarded to students of Greek heritage)
- **State of Massachusetts:** \$1,000.00 (Awarded to students that reside in the state of Massachusetts)
- **Anatolia Legacy:** \$1,000.00 (Awarded to students whose grandparent(s), parent(s), or sibling(s) graduated from Anatolia College or ACT)

TUITION AND FEES

Tuition

Estimated full-time yearly for 2020 - 2021: **\$10,080.00 ***

* This indicates registering for ten 3-credit courses per year.

The cost per credit hour is \$336.00. Tuition at ACT is charged per credit hour registered. Tuition is paid per semester. The cost of auditing a course is set to be equal to half of normal tuition. Tuition and fees may be revised annually and will be announced each year in late summer.

Book Cost

For the majority of the courses, the college provides textbooks in the form of eBooks and/or handout material for each course, at no additional cost to the student.

Fees

Pertinent fees are added to the above tuition amount as per the following schedule:

General fees

- Application fee (non-refundable): \$50.00
- International/US Degree- Seeking Student fee (Freshman one-time fee): \$240.00
- On-campus Housing Deposit fee (non-refundable): \$360.00
- Enrollment Deposit fee (non-refundable) to confirm attendance by May 1st: \$650.00

Academic fees

- Library fee (paid by all students regardless of no. of classes taken): \$47.00
- Science Lab fee (for Science classes only): \$120.00
- Computer Science Lab fee (Only for CS courses taught exclusively in a computer lab): \$120.00

- Official Transcript request fee: \$5.00
- Late Registration/Pay fee: \$67.00
