




STUDY ABROAD: STUDY A SEMESTER OR A YEAR IN NEW ZEALAND

As a Study Abroad student, you can study at AUT in Auckland for a semester or a year in your chosen subject or in a completely different discipline. By studying with us, you can gain access to everything New Zealand has to offer, while taking part in world-class academic courses, designed to give you powerful, practical, culturally immersive and collaborative learning experiences.

We will give you a unique Kiwi welcome to AUT and New Zealand, and support you while you settle into life and study here.



Workload

A typical full-time semester at AUT is 60 points, which is equivalent to four courses. Most courses are 15 points.



SEMESTER DATES

Because New Zealand is in the Southern Hemisphere, we have different seasons and dates for our university semesters. Our summer lasts from mid-December to late March. Autumn is between late March and late May. Winter is between June and the end of August. Spring is from September through November.

Our semesters are typically 12 weeks long. Semester 1 begins in late February and ends in late June. Our Semester 2 begins mid–July and ends mid–November. There is a two-week mid–semester break in the middle of each full semester, allowing you to enjoy more of what New Zealand has to offer.

Your placement manager will help you find an organisation, develop your resumé, prepare for your interview, and provide overarching support throughout your time in the course. YOUR NEW HOME: LIVING ON CAMPUS

Living on campus can be a great option for students – you will only be minutes away from AUT and it's an easy way to meet other students.

AUT accommodation options

Te Ähuru Mayoral Drive Student Accommodation

City Campus

- One-minute walk from AUT's main buildings
- Brand-new, purpose-built, high-spec studio units
- Each unit includes a king single bed, kitchenette with fridge and microwave, bathroom, study desk and chair, storage space
- There are 25 bedrooms (one on each floor) for students with special access needs
- On-site services and facilities include a recreation centre and sports court, 24/7 security, and shared study, social and dining spaces

Wellesley Student Apartments

City Campus

- Three minutes' walk from AUT's main buildings
- Each apartment is fully furnished with four or five bedrooms, two bathrooms, a shared lounge/dining area and a kitchen
- There are three bedroom sizes to choose from and every bedroom has a king single bed, wardrobe, desk, chair, bookshelf and heated towel rail
- There are 13 bedrooms in the facility available for students with special access needs
- On-site services and facilities include staff who are available 24/7, outdoor spaces and laundry

Akoranga Student Village

North Campus

- Five minutes' walk from AUT's main buildings
- Each apartment is fully furnished with four or five bedrooms, two bathrooms, a shared lounge/dining area and a kitchen
- Some bedrooms have a double bed and some have a single bed
- All bedrooms have a wardrobe, desk, chair and bookshelf
- There are eight bedrooms in the facility available for students with special access needs (including bathrooms open to the person)
- On-site services and facilities include staff who are available 24/7, outdoor spaces and laundry

When you apply to live in AUT student accommodation, you can request to stay in an alcohol-free, single sex or rainbow-friendly apartment.

READY TO APPLY?

Excited about joining us and making the most of what AUT and New Zealand have to offer? The information below outlines what you need to do to get started.

Check if you're eligible

To join the Study Abroad programme, you must have:

- Completed at least one year of full-time study at a recognised university (two years for the internship option)
- A better than average academic record, especially in your most recent year of study (or a GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale for the internship option)
- English language requirements (if English is not your first language):
 - An IELTS (Academic) score of 6.0 overall with all bands 5.5 or higher for undergraduate programmes
 - An IELTS (Academic) score of 6.5 overall with all bands 6.0 or higher for postgraduate programmes
- · Be at least 18 years of age

You can apply for Study Abroad online – visit apply.aut.ac.nz

Application checklist

You will need to have certain documents ready when you apply:

- Current passport that won't expire while you're in New Zealand
- · Official, current transcript
- Health insurance
- IELTS results if applicable
- A New Zealand visa that allows you to study

Application deadlines

Make sure you apply by:

- 30 November each year (to start in February/Semester 1)
- 30 April each year (to start in July/Semester 2)

Fees and costs

The current fees for our Study Abroad programme are listed below. All prices are in New Zealand dollars.

Fees per semester for 2024

- Tuition fee for Study Abroad: NZ\$13,000 per semester (for AUT 60 points)
- Placement fee (study-internship option only): NZ\$1,000
- Compulsory insurance premium: NZ\$405 per semester
- Student Services Levy: \$573 per semester

Living costs

If you're coming to New Zealand on a student visa, Immigration New Zealand currently requires you to have enough funds to cover a return ticket home. You will also need to have enough money to adequately cover your living costs. Living costs can vary considerably depending on your lifestyle. New Zealand student visa

One of the most important steps is to get your student visa organised before you reach New Zealand. Without a valid visa and medical/travel insurance it's unlawful to study in New Zealand. To find out more visit immigration.govt.nz or studyinnewzealand.govt.nz/how-to-apply/visas

Medical and travel insurance

The New Zealand Government requires all international students to have appropriate insurance. Most international students are not entitled to publicly funded health services while in New Zealand. If you receive medical treatment during your visit, you may be liable for the full costs of the treatment. That's why it's so important that you have medical and travel insurance while studying at AUT. To make it easy, we include AUT's default medical insurance, the Studentsafe Inbound University plan, as part of your Offer of Place. However, you don't have to accept the AUT insurance policy, and can choose an alternative from an approved provider on our website. To find out more visit aut.ac.nz/international/insurance
